Since 2007, our action-driven organization has built a nationwide network of community-based organizations that has led local, state, and national initiatives ensuring AAPIs are represented and heard. Our work focuses on:



Getting AAPIs to be counted in the US Census, registered to vote, and out to vote while also protecting the freedom to vote so that they can use their collective voices to advocate on issues important to them.



Identifying and investing in trusted organizations that directly serve AAPIs by providing them with expert training and financial resources to effectively engage with their community members of diverse ages, backgrounds, and languages.



Conducting research and supporting policies that help AAPIs build collective power by expanding and strengthening the public's recognition of AAPIs as a growing national force as the margin of victory.

Working closely with a deep network of partners, our organizing and communications efforts have encouraged millions of AAPIs to participate in the US Census and vote in local, state, and federal elections. The results are clear: AAPIs are determining the outcomes of elections, resulting in our communities being recognized and addressed.

APIAVote's Core Competencies:



APIAVote's approach is unique because of our commitment to developing functional, goal-oriented relationships with organizations who are trusted by our communities. APIAVote



and its active ACE network of grassroots partners are **trusted not only by their community, but also by funders, elected officials, corporate leaders, and the media** for their understanding of and responsiveness to our communities, who are made up of more than 50 ethnicities and speak over 100 different languages and dialects. Here is a sample of how our approach creates impact and is building real power:



In the 2020 election, despite the rise in anti-Asian hate and the COVID epidemic, AAPI voter turnout was record-breaking, increasing their turnout by 49.7% compared to 2016. This was due in large part to APIAVote's national voter engagement strategy that touched nearly 700,000 AAPI households with mailers that reflected their communities, and phone and text banking, and targeted digital ads that connected with voters in the language and dialects that they are most comfortable.

For the 2020 Census, APIAVote and its ACE network conducted a major *Get Out The Count* campaign. This campaign explained the importance of the US Census in the languages and dialects that encouraged participation. This resulted in the Census showing that the population of Asian Americans is growing by double digits in 49 states and the District of Columbia, and that Pacific Islanders are also growing by double digits in 48 states and District of Columbia.





At the local level, AAPI communities are strengthening their voices and impact with support from APIAVote. For example, in Las Vegas, the Asian Community Development Council ("ACDC") began with a successful voter registration initiative funded by APIAVote in 2015. Today, ACDC has become the area's preeminent AAPI community organization with a \$3 million budget.

The strength of APIAVote's ACE network and unique capabilities, there is a growing national recognition of AAPIs as a key constituency who's needs, and concerns deserve direct attention.
