LARGEST, MOST REPRESENTATIVE public opinion panel of AANHPIS

- Interviews in English and Asian languages with largest need: Mandarin, Cantonese, Korean, and Vietnamese
- Designed to be representative of the AANHPI U.S. household population, including all 50 states
- U.S. households are randomly selected with a known, non-zero probability from the NORC National Frame as well as address based sample (ABS) frames

LINGUISTICALLY AND CULTURALLY SKILLED OUTREACH

- 92% of households offered a language in which they are comfortable
- Design recruitment and surveys to maximize engagement







Key Findings

Four Things You Should Know About the AAPI Data/AP-NORC Poll Among Asian American, Native Hawaiian, and Pacific Islander adults in the U.S.:

- 1. 66% report their household expenses have increased in the past year.
- 2. 38% describe their financial situation as poor; 65% say the same about the national economy.
- 3. 16% hold some form of medical debt, but 40% have little to no confidence they could pay for an unexpected medical bill, and 78% think Congress should tackle health care costs.
- 4. 49% believe the United States is not supportive enough of the Palestinians in the conflict with Israelis, while 48% think the United States is too supportive of the Israelis.

































AAPI adults are more likely to view Israel as a partner or ally to the U.S. than a rival or adversary.











The Israelis: US too supportive, not supportive enough, or about right in its support? by Party ID and Age















How to describe U.S. relationship with JAPAN - by Race and Ethnicity




How to describe U.S. relationship with ISRAEL - by Race and Ethnicity














Muslim communities in US: US too supportive, not supportive enough, or about right in its support? by Race and Ethnicity












Issues for Congress to Prioritize: Health Care - by Party ID and Age








Issues for Congress to Prioritize: Housing - by Race and Ethnicity






Issues for Congress to Prioritize: Housing - by Nativity, Language, and Gender






Household debt: higher, lower or about the same as it was a year ago? by Race and Ethnicity











Household expenses: higher, lower or about the same as it was a year ago? by Race and Ethnicity






Household expenses: higher, lower or about the same as it was a year ago? by Party ID and Age






Household expenses: higher, lower or about the same as it was a year ago? by Nativity, Language, and Gender






Households with student debt - by Race and Ethnicity
