LARGEST, MOST REPRESENTATIVE public opinion panel of AANHPIs

- Interviews in English and Asian languages with largest need: Mandarin, Cantonese, Korean, and Vietnamese
- Designed to be representative of the AANHPI U.S. household population, including all 50 states
- U.S. households are randomly selected with a known,non-zero probability from the NORC National Frame as well as address based sample (ABS) frames

LINGUISTICALLY AND CULTURALLY SKILLED OUTREACH

- 92% of households offered a language in which they are comfortable
- Design recruitment and surveys to maximize engagement



Key Findings

PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE FAVORABILITY

- Joe Biden and Kamala Harris are viewed more favorably than unfavorably, while majorities of AAPI adults view Donald Trump and Ron DeSantis unfavorably.
- More AAPI adults have unfavorable views of Nikki Haley and Vivek Ramaswamy than favorable views, a large proportion say that they don't know enough about the two candidates (40% and 46%, respectively) to form an opinion.
- Half identify as Democrats, just over a quarter identify as Republican, and about one in five identify as independent or having no party attachment.

RACISM AS A SERIOUS PROBLEM

 86% say racism is a serious issue in this country, including 51% who say it's very or extremely serious. Those who say racism is a serious issue tend to identify as Democrats, speak primarily English at home, or have personally experienced a hate crime.

Key Findings

HATE CRIMES AND HATE INCIDENTS

- A third (34%) of AAPI adults report experiencing some sort of hate incident, including verbal harassment (23%), being called racial slurs (22%)
- 16% have been victim of a hate crime such as threats of physical assault (11%) or threats of damage to property (8%).

MENTAL HEALTH AND ANXIETY

- Sixty-nine percent of AAPI adults say their mental health is very good or excellent, while 23% saying good, and 8% say it is fair or poor.
- 12% of AAPI adults are at higher risk of an anxiety disorder. Nearly seven in ten say they have experienced at least one stressor such as feeling irritable (50%), worrying too much (49%), or having trouble relaxing (46%) in the last two weeks.




Presidential Candidate Favorability

Biden Favorability among Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders


















DeSantis Favorability among Asian Americans, Native Hawaiians and Pacific Islanders




Racism, Hate Crimes, and Hate Incidents

Most AAPI adults believe that Black adults experience significant discrimination.





Definitions

HATE CRIMES vs. HATE INCIDENTS

Following the U.S. Department of Justice definition

- Hate crimes involve:
 - Physical assault
 - Property damage
 - Threats of assault or property damage
- Other actions are classified as hate incidents, such as:
 - Verbal harassment
 - Racial or ethnic slurs
 - Being spit or coughed upon



About a third of AAPI adults have suffered a hate incident in the past

year.


Percent of AAPI adults that say yes

Percent of AAPI adults







Definitions

ANXIETY

General Anxiety Disorder-7 (GAD-7) Scale


- Scores range from 0–21 with increasing scores indicating greater severity of symptoms of anxiety.
- Overall score of 10 or above is defined as a higher risk of anxiety disorder, with scores greater than 15 defined as severe anxiety.
- Examples of anxiety indicators in the GAD-7:
 - Becoming easily annoyed or irritable
 - Worrying too much about different things
 - Not being able to stop or control worrying
 - Trouble relaxing
 - Feeling afraid, as if something awful might happen





Anxiety (Generalized Anxiety Disorder GAD-7 Scale)
